<b>Courses taught:</b>	1/ Regulation of the performance of professions of public trust; 2/ Customs law; 3/ The structure and functioning of the national tax administration; 4/ Introduction to Public Economic Law; 5/ Public economic law.
<b>Characteristics of the seminar:</b>	
<b>Main thematic areas of the seminar:</b>	- financial law, public finance, tax law; - public economic law, consumer protection law; - economic analysis of law (economic and legal aspects of regulations, e.g. criminal law, tax law); - disciplinary responsibility.
<b>Example topics of theses written under the supervision of a supervisor:</b>	1/ Legal and economic aspects of organized crime. 2/ Control in economic activity (selected aspects). 3/ Consumer protection in cyberspace. 4/ Mediation as a form of amicable resolution of disputes in economic matters.
<b>Example topics of diploma theses – to be completed at the beginning of the 2025/2026 seminar:</b>	1/ Consumer protection in a selected market (e.g. financial). 2/ Legal aspects of exercising a profession of public trust (e.g. lawyer, notary). 3/ Cybercrime in the financial market (selected aspects). 4/ Importance of customs for the realization of state budget revenues. 5/ Anti-dumping and anti-dumping proceedings (selected issues). 6/ Selected legal aspects of the functioning of regional economic integration by example (e.g. ASEAN). 7/ World Trade Organization (selected problems).
<b>Course of the seminar:</b>	Seminars are held in a seminar group. The seminar in all semesters follows a similar pattern. Students prepare specific parts of the thesis, which are periodically discussed in seminars (on average two to three times per semester).
<b>Frequency of seminar meetings:</b>	According to the timetable, on average every 2-3 weeks (depending on the number of seminar hours in the semester).
<b>Obligations of a student participating in the seminar:</b>	To prepare the consecutive parts of the thesis according to the syllabus, the arrangements in the seminar and to submit them for checking within the deadlines agreed for the whole seminar group. Revise the checked parts of the work and send them for checking within the deadlines agreed in the seminar.

**Conditions for passing the seminar:**

According to the syllabus. As a rule, they are as follows:

- first semester of the seminar - choosing the topic and preparing the thesis plan, draft bibliography, writing a few pages of the first chapter, correcting the thesis according to the promoter's remarks, discussing, among other things, research methods, methods and techniques of writing the thesis, basic formal and editorial principles of writing the thesis, principles of selecting source material, composition of the thesis,
- second semester seminar - preparing at least 50% of the thesis and correcting it according to the promoter's remarks,
- third semester of the seminar - preparing 100% of the dissertation, correcting it according to the promoter's remarks, submitting it to an anti-plagiarism check and correcting it if the result is negative, until the final acceptance of the final version by the promoter.
